## UNITED WAY WORKS FOR YOU

United Way of Rutland County's Targeted Impact Programs directly meet needs identified by the community, with the ultimate goal of facilitating selfsustaining programs.

Happy Feet, serving children in need of new shoes, came about when we heard that local teachers and nurses were purchasing quality shoes for children who could not afford them. United Way



of Rutland County does not believe our educators should have to do this, so we are truly grateful for the community support we receive for this wonderful program!

Turning Point Recovery
Coaches have worked
closely with 9 of the
women who were, or are
currently, living at the
(womens) Dismas House.
Four of Turning Point's
female coaches have



been assigned to work daily with the house to support not only the residents but staff as well. We created a warm, safe and welcoming environment in our on site office, in which We have established all of our initial coaching relationships with the women. By building up these relationships and participating in weekly house meetings, monthly dinners, daily office hours, facilitating a weekly womens' empowerment group and attending weekly Dismas and Turning Point staff meetings, we have developed a model that best suits the needs of the women and the staff at the house. Without funding we would not have the opportunity to offer the level of daily support integrated into this program. We have been able to support several women through the struggles and barriers that accompany the journey these women are on to recovery and community reintegration.

Partnering with community donors, our Welcome to Winter provides hats and gloves/mittens to the children of Rutland County. Through collaboration of area



schools, we are able to identify concerns and distribute according to need.

VT Cares provides life-saving harm reduction services, education and resources to



Vermonters affected by HIV, Hepatitis C and substance use by increasing access to care, reducing social stigmas and building relationships. This year UWRC funded VT CARES with the Overdose Data To Action Grant to create marketing materials that are brighter and easier to read materials to be more welcoming to participants.

Dismas House is a supportive community for former prisoners transitioning from incarceration. Dismas provides transitional housing for formerly incarcerated people and recruits university students and international volunteers to live in the house. Living in community accomplishes the Dismas mission of reconciliation and continues the original Dismas model. Giving women the opportunity to succeed in a supportive environment makes all the difference to their success.

Helping the Helpers: Using the Body to Heal BUILDING STRENGTH THROUGH WELLNESS: RECHARGING DURING COVID In this interactive conference we discussed



the impact that acute and chronic stress has on first responders and other helping professionals. We explored some common barriers to seek help and how to overcome these hurdles.
